

Cot Shaped Card Instructions

Step 1



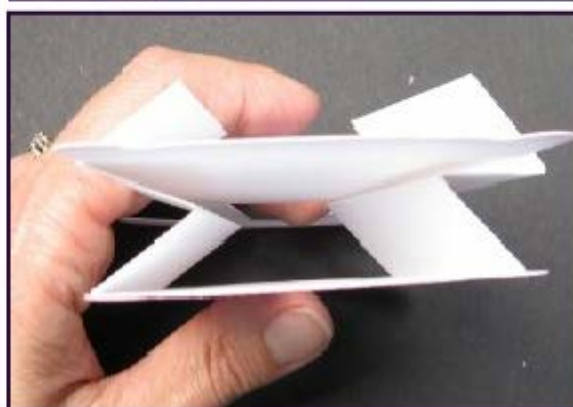
First cut your templates out. Cut out three of the curtain template - you will see why later!

I have popped the curtain pieces through the Cuttlebug to give them a lovely texture. I have also sponged the edges of all the cot pieces in pink ink.



Step 2

Concertina fold the flaps at the side of the front piece, and place the back piece under the back flaps as shown.

Step 3



Put double-sided tape on the flaps, then hold the cot up to make sure the front and back pieces are aligned. When you are happy, push the flaps round the back to stick them down.

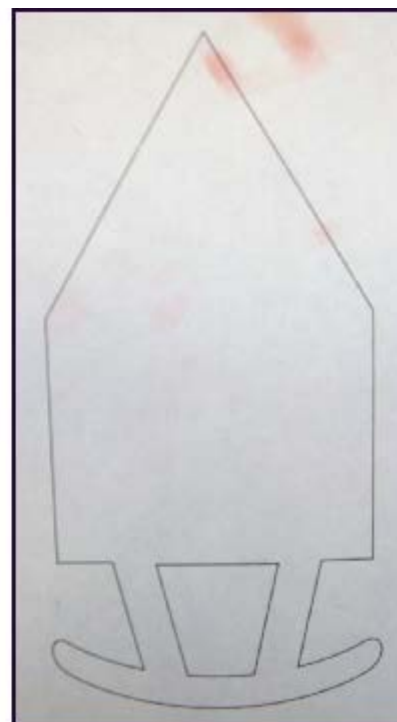


Step 4



Your cot now looks like this.

Now print off the pdf for positioning which we will use to put the curtain and the cot together.

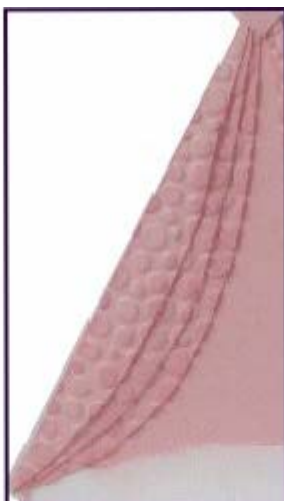
Step 5



Using the print out to guide you, place the back of the curtain on your workspace. Attach double-sided tape to the back of your cot and attach it to the curtain, again using the print out to guide you where to place it.



Step 6



Now we are going to stick the curtain pieces to the back piece.

The reason I have cut out three curtains, is because I stick one on to the back as shown. I then trim a bit off the next piece and stick it on top, then trim a bit more off the third piece, and stick that on next, giving a lovely 3D effect.

Step 7



For the finishing touches, I punched a heart shape and added it to the top of the curtain. I pushed the cot flat so that I could see where the centre of the heart was, and added a gem to it.
